WHY

The objective is to work closely with athletes and the ISSF to voice opinions and to establish a direct link with the athletes and the ISSF.

WHOM TO ELECT

Thirteen athletes were suggested by our ISSF Member Federations as possible candidates. The prerequisites to become a candidate are never to be found guilty of doping and to have participated at the last Olympic Games or at previous or present World Championships. Please see the list of candidates.

HOW IT WORKS

Each accredited athlete in the senior (open) categories can visit the Athletes Election Booth and will receive a voting card with the proposed candidates. After voting each athlete will receive a USB flash drive. A maximum of four (4) votes per voting card and athlete is possible. The four athletes holding the most votes will automatically be part of the ISSF Athletes Committee. The remaining three athletes with their Chairman will be appointed at the next ISSF Executive Committee Meeting.

WHERE TO GET AND DROP THE VOTING CARDS

The voting cards have to be obtained and immediately be dropped at the Athletes Election Booth (next to the ISSF Shop).

Nasser Salih Nasser Abdullah Al-Attiyah (Arabic: ناصر صالح ناصر عبدالله العطية; born 21 December 1970 in Doha) is a Qatari rally driver and sport shooter. He was the 2006 Production World Rally Champion, an eight-time Middle East Rally Champion and the 2011 Dakar Rally winner.^[1] He currently competes in the World and Middle East Rally Championships for the Qatar World Rally Team.^[2] In shooting, Al-Attiyah won the bronze medal in the men's skeet event at the 2012 Summer Olympics in London.

Career

Al-Attiyah won the PWRC in 2006,^[3] his third year in the championship alongside co-driver Chris Patterson, driving a Subaru Impreza. He gained the championship lead after finishing second in the PWRC class in the Rally Mexico and afterwards won the following two rounds, Rally Argentina and Acropolis Rally. He continued competing in both the PWRC and the Middle East Rally Championship.^[4]

After winning the 2008 FIA Cross Country Rally World Cup in a BMW, he took part alongside Swedish female co-driver Tina Thörner in the 2009 Dakar Rally in Argentina.^[5] He was among the frontrunners until he got disqualified on 8 January 2009 after he had missed 9 checkpoints, the rules stating that 4 missed checkpoints are the maximum.^[6] He finished second in the Rally dos Sertões from Goiânia to Natal in Brazil (24 June–3 July 2009) behind Carlos Sainz of Spain.^[7]

In the 2010 Dakar Rally, Al-Attiyah finished second, 2'12" behind Carlos Sainz, the smallest gap in the history of the race.^[8] On 15 January 2011, Al-Attiyah won the legendary Dakar race ahead of fellow Volkswagen drivers Sainz and Giniel de Villiers,^[9] making him the only Arab to ever win the difficult race.^[10]

In the World Rally Championship, Al-Attiyah scored his first points during the 2009 season, finishing eighth in the Rally Argentina. In 2010 and 2011, he drove for the Barwa Rally Team in the Super 2000 World Rally Championship, a WRC support championship for Super 2000 cars, classifying seventh overall in both years. For the 2012 season, Al-Attiyah moved to compete in the top division for the Qatar World Rally Team. He secured a career-best fourth place at the Rally de Portugal.^[11]

In shooting, Al-Attiyah came in fourth place in the 2004 Olympic Games in clay pigeon shooting^[12] and 15th overall in the 2008 Olympic Games, missing out on qualification for the final round by 2 points.^[13] In the 2012 Olympics Games he won the bronze medal after a shoot-off against Valeriy Shomin.^{[14][15]}

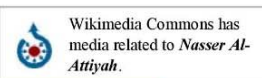

Abhinav Bindra is India's first and only individual Olympic Gold Medallist and also the first Indian shooter to win a World Championship Gold. Born in DehraDun, the thirty one year old Air rifle shooter is a four time Olympian who has also won Asian and Commonwealth titles.

He is the recipient of the Atjuna Award and the Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna Award (India's most prestigious sport awards), and was decorated with the Padma Bhushan which is India's third highest civilian award. He was conferred a title of Lt. Col. (Hony.) in the Indian Army.

His victory at the Beijing Olympics was not just a personal triumph, it was a gift to his nation, a breaking down of a sporting barrier that had stood for a century. Bindra's feat taught his peers and those yet to come, that an Olympic gold isn't an impossible dream. In ranges, on fields, in arenas, Indian athletes now own a new belief, they wear the knowledge that no challenge is beyond them.

He served as a member of the ISSF athletes commission from 2010 to 2014. Bindra who has been an active competitive shooter for the last 18 years has fought passionately for athletes rights and better facilities for them. He also represented the shooting athletes at the international Olympic committee athletes forum and represented the Indian athletes at the IOC meetings during India's suspension from the Olympic movement.
